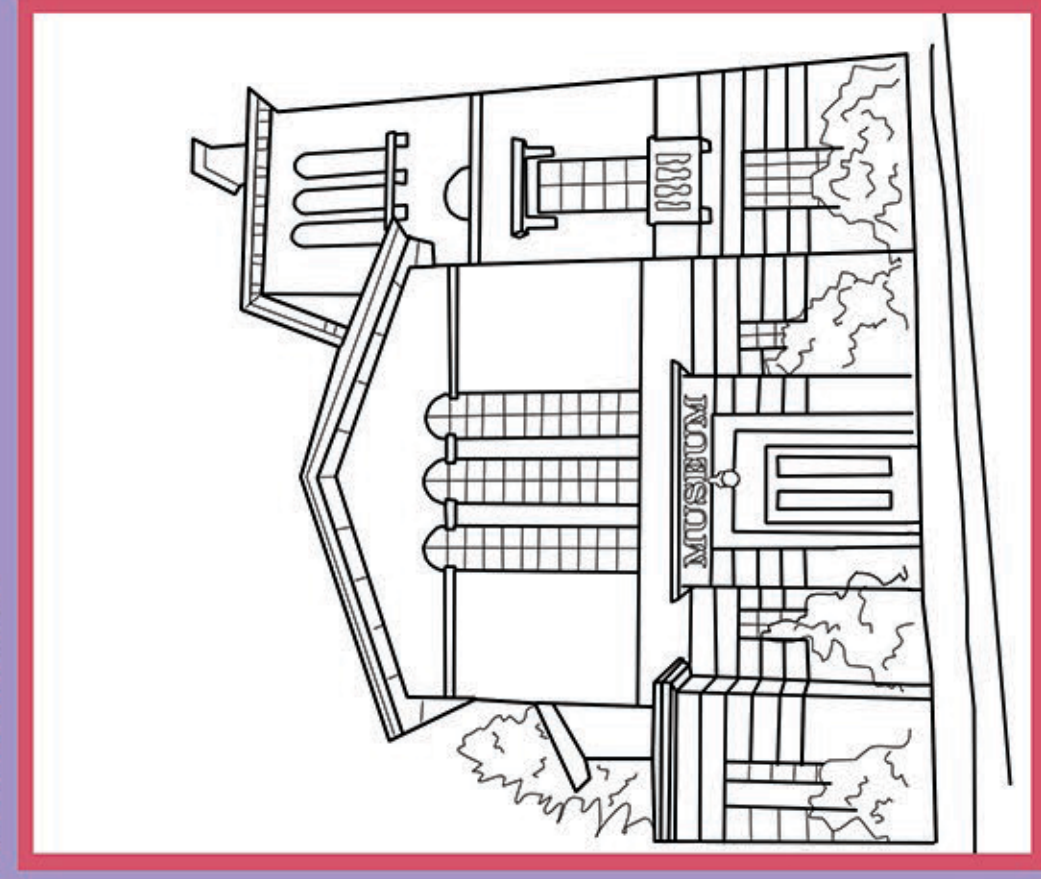

Always take care when crossing roads!

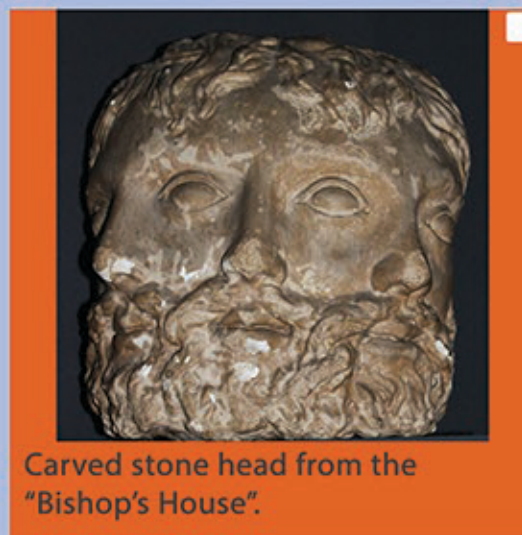
Medieval pottery sherd found at the site of Elgin castle on Lady Hill.



Medieval pottery jug found during excavations at 213-225 High Street.



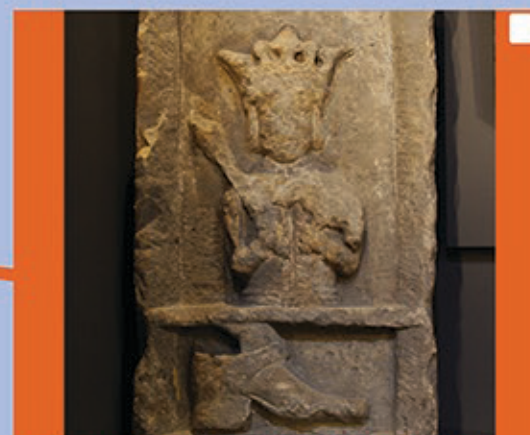
Carved stone head from the "Bishop's House".

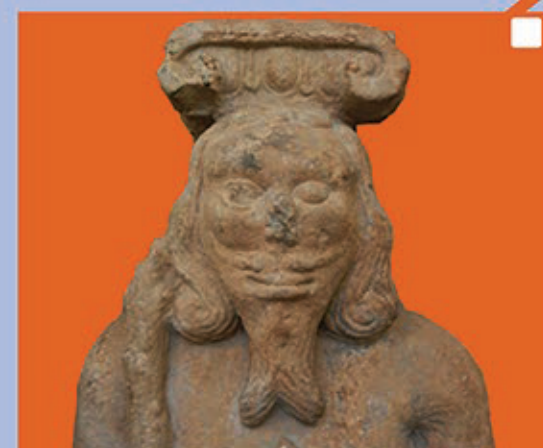
