The Archive of the Incorporated Trades of Elgin

Archives of the Trade Incorporations of Elgin, including the Convenery of Incorporated Trades, were donated to The Moray Society as each craft organisation wound up its business between 2004 and 2014. These muniments and various artefacts were then accessioned into the collection of The Elgin Museum. Several artefacts belonging to various trades had already been donated (during the 1920s and 1930s) and were reaccessioned in 1994.

The archive of the Incorporated Trades of Elgin consists of some 20 shelf-feet of bound volumes and miscellaneous papers. These documents were arranged and packaged during 2016 - 2017. The calendar of the collection was then prepared by Dr John Barrett, with assistance from Mr Oliver Taylor and Ms Christine Clerk.

Archive sources for the history of craftsmen's organisations in Elgin during the Middle Ages are not preserved. Craftsmen's incorporations in Elgin are documented from the sixteenth century onwards in occasional references among the archives of the royal burgh. The crafts themselves preserved no muniments prior to the mid-seventeenth century.

On 5 October 1657 Elgin Town Council issued a charter giving formal recognition to several incorporations of burgh craftsmen. The 1657 charter is usually referred to among the trades as the 'Magna Charta'. The charter formalised relationships among the craftsmen's incorporations, the magistrates and town council of Elgin, and the merchants of the royal burgh. The terms of the 'Magna Charta', were subsequently clarified and amended, and the Incorporated Trades achieved increased independence and political involvement. A collection of the principal constitutional documents was copied for the Shoemaker Incorporations. (Trades.Sho1.10)

Seven trade incorporations were recognised in 1657: butchers/fleshers, glovers, hammermen, skimmers, tailors, weavers and wrights. The joint interests of these independent incorporations were managed by a Convenery of Incorporated Trades.

None of the seven incorporated trades preserved a complete archive. Early minutes are amissing for every craft. There are no surviving muniments relating to the shortlived (or stillborn) Butcher Incorporation. The Shoemaker Incorporation preserved the most complete series of minutes, covering the period 1669 to 2004; though at least one volume is amissing for the years 1770 - 1787. The Tailor Incorporation possessed minutes from 1668 onwards, which were consulted by W. E. Watson who gathered extracts while compiling *The Incorporated Trades of Elgin* (c. 1960) (Trades.Con9.1.4.1 - 6). However, the Tailor's minute books have since been lost, together with subsequent records down to 2004. The Hammermen's records were among the many lost documents that were consulted by Dr Geddes during research for a series of papers published during 1852 - 4 (reprinted in Trades.Con9.1.9); and Hammermen's minutes from 1812 onwards survived to be consulted by W. E. Watson during the 1950s. The surviving archive of the Hammermen Incorporation is said to have been destroyed in a fire around 1990, and no papers were deposited when the Incorporated Trades closed.
