- 1)** 'Bed Mell' Mallet. Wood. Thought to be used for taking down or putting up beds as necessary.

- 2)** Plane. Iron, wood and bone..

- 3)** Instrument. Iron. Used to prevent a calf from sucking.

- 4)** Mole Trap. Spiked iron.

- 5)** Mouse Trap. Double guillotine. 1896. Oak and iron.

- 6)** Medal. 1<sup>st</sup> Prize for 'Thin Scones' and awarded to Mrs Hossack of Thornhill, Elgin, at the Morayshire Farmers' Club centenary show in 1899.

- 7)** Harness Ornament.

- 9)** Model Plough. Andrew Grant, a blacksmith of Rothes, probably made this plough as a model to be shown to farmers in the 1880s. Andrew Grant gave it to the Museum after his retirement. [\[ELGNM 1933.1\]](#)

- 11)** Snuff-Mull. Communal ram's horn snuff-mull presented to Morayshire Farmers' Club by the Earl of Fife in 1818.
